WI Salt Wise Updates

<u>Salt Wise Communications Toolkit</u>- Shared in the Ripple Effects Newsletter emailed on Dec. 23rd with links to an article template, Facebook graphics and posting schedule thanks to Hannah Molhelnitzky. We also have a new flyers and salt bucket cups and laminated signs available.

Opportunity to Engage School Maintenance Staff- WI Salt Wise partners are offering to give a short presentation at a school district custodial/facilities staff meeting in MAMSWaP communities on salt reduction strategies. Free Salt Wise toolkits will be offered to staff that attend he presentation and request one. Toolkits include: an Ultimate Scraper, Snow Pusher shovel hand spreader, WI Salt Wise cups and laminated salt bucket signs. If you are interested, please email Christal contact info for your school district's facility/custodial manager.

Small Equipment Winter Calibration Training-MAMSWaP partnered with Reinders to hold a calibration training for walk behind broadcast and drop spreaders on Nov. 12th the their facility in Madison. Registration was capped at 10 per session and 7 people attended. About half the participants were from private companies and half from City of Madison. The small scale hands on format worked really well as we were able to have discussions and do some problem solving on the spot. Variation in grain size from one bag or one load to the next is a big barrier to reducing salt use. We hope to repeat this training with Reinders earlier in the season next year.

WI Salt Wise LTE- WI Salt Wise partners including Madison Metro. Sewerage District, City of Madison, Dane County and MAMSWaP are contributing funds to hire a part-time LTE to coordinate and expand outreach and training efforts to reduce salt use and chloride inputs to our waters. The I&E Team approved a \$5000 contribution from MAMSWaP to support this position. The position will be housed at MMSD and will run through 2020. The goal of this position will be to work close with WI Salt Wise partners to develop a work plan and begin implementation of the plan. The hope is to find more stable funding to support this position into 2021.

Plant Dane Native Plant Program and Rain Garden Workshop

We are accepting orders for Plant Dane plants. 44 native plant species and 5 garden kits are being offered as part of the Plant Dane Native Plant program this year. The list is very similar to last year. Plants cost \$2.25 each and must be ordered in packs of 4. Orders and payment will again be accepted through the Dane Co. order site along with donations to the Free Native Plants for Community Projects. We received 22 applications for the spring cycle of the Free Native Plants for Community Projects program. Deadline to order or donate plants is March 20th with pick up on May 30th. Tools to helps spread the word including a link to a template article are available on our Partner Resources page-https://ripple-effects.com/Partner-Resources.

MAMSWaP is also hosting a Rain Garden Workshop at the Fitchburg Community Center on Sat., Feb. 29th from 8:30-11:30. The workshop will focus on helping participants new to the world of rain garden design through the process of actually designing a rain garden plan for their property. It will include exercises, demonstrations and resources to guide participants through the process of site selection, sizing, site preparation, and plant selection. Information on installation and maintenance will also be provided. Experts will be available to answer questions. Cost is \$10. Visit https://ripple-effects.com/Event/Home/Detail/689 to register.
